David L. Meyer serves as Deputy Assistant Attorney General for Civil Enforcement at the Antitrust Division of the U.S. Department of Justice, where he oversees three of the Division's civil sections: Litigation II, Litigation III and Networks and Technology Enforcement. From 1989 to 2006, he practiced at Covington & Burling in Washington, D.C., where he became partner in 1994 and served as Vice Chair of the firm's Antitrust and Consumer Law Practice Group. At Covington, he counseled corporate clients on issues related to pricing, joint ventures, and distribution arrangements. He also represented parties in merger-related enforcement actions in the healthcare, energy and other industries, and litigated private antitrust matters involving pharmaceutical and transportation companies, among others. Mr. Meyer has published articles on antitrust issues and served as Associate Editor of the ABA Antitrust Section's *Antitrust Magazine*.

Mr. Meyer previously served in the Antitrust Division from 1987 to 1989 as Special Assistant to Assistant Attorney General Charles F. Rule. He graduated from Yale Law School in 1986, where he served as Senior Editor of the *Yale Law Journal* and editor of the *Yale Journal on Regulation*. From 1986 to 1987, he clerked for Judge Ralph K. Winter of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit. Mr. Meyer earned his B.A. in economics from Amherst College, graduating *magna cum laude* in 1983.
