## NEWSLETTER

### £1.6 MILLION RAISED IN DONATIONS AND PLEDGES

The aim of the Development Appeal is to raise sufficient funds both to secure the Institute's work and in particular to aid its expansion in certain key areas, namely: the role and contribution of International Law; Global Business Law; Protection of Human Rights and Common Law in Europe. The Appeal is chaired by Lord Goff of Chieveley, with Jeremy Carver as Vice-Chairman, John Merrett as Deputy Vice-Chairman and Sir Jeremy Lever as Treasurer.

The Appeal has received approximately £1.6 million in donations and pledges of support for the future. The Development Appeal Committee, has been very active on the Institute's behalf and has approached a wide range of constituencies to achieve this funding. Nearly £100,000 has been donated by the members of the Institute's own Council of Management; £233,000 has been contributed by the Bar and recent funding from the Nuffield Foundation of £25,000 brings the total raised to date from trusts to well over £400,000.

A number of other fundraising initiatives are underway, making us confident that we will reach our target of £2 million early in the New Year. ### PUBLICATIONS

The two-volume *Jurisdiction and Enforcement of Judgments in Civil and Commercial Matters: ECJ Judgments*, edited by Paolo Galizzi, was published in September. This contains over a hundred decisions of the European Court of Justice on the interpretation of the Brussels Convention from 1976 onwards, as well as the Advocate General's opinions for each case.

Other publications include Esin Öricü (ed) *Judicial Comparativism in Human Rights Cases* in the UKNCCL series, and Jean-Victor Louis and Assimakis Komninos (eds) *The Euro: Law, Politics, Economics*, produced within the framework of the 'Eurospectator' research project of the European University Institute in Florence in cooperation with the British Institute. Volume 2 of the Reports and Conclusions of the XXth FIDE Conference was also published this month.

## PROJECTS

### **Enforcement Agency Practice in Europe**

This project, funded by the European Commission, examines the structure, status and procedures of judicial enforcement agencies in a selection of EU Member States, and the implications for individuals and companies in seeking enforcement of judgments within the European Judicial Area.

The second meeting of the European Research Interchange (ERI) that was established to carry out this project was held in Heidelberg on 12 July, and was also well-attended by representatives of Member States' enforcement agencies. The project has now entered its third phase, with the members of the ERI finalizing the country reports and commentaries that will comprise two publications: a book and a manual for enforcement practitioners.

Mads Andenas is project leader supported by Dr Sebastian Kuck, David Spivack and Hugo Warner. Other jurisdictions are covered by Professors Burkhard Hess and Marcus Mack (Tübingen), Professor Ton Jongbloed (Utrecht), Professor Paul Oberhammer (Vienna), Professor Juan Pablo Correa Delcasso (Barcelona), Professor Marie-Laure Niboyet and Dr Sabine Lacassagne (Paris-Nanterre), Professors Torbjorn Andersson and Hugo Fridén (Uppsala) and Professor Giuseppe Olivieri (Naples).

### **Enforcement Proceedings in the EU Member States**

The Institute has recently joined a research group on the related topic of enforcement systems in civil and commercial matters in the EU Member States. The project is funded by the European Commission and based at the University of Heidelberg. Dr Sebastian Kuck attended the last meeting of the research group. Focus is on the transparency of assets, provisional enforcement, protective measures and the attachment of bank accounts. Sebastian Kuck and David Spivack are the current researchers working on the project in co-operation with the Enforcement Law Reform Group.

### **Capital Maintenance Regimes in the EU and UK**

The Company Law Centre has established an Inter-disciplinary Group on Capital Maintenance. Members of and advisers to the group which is presided by Jonathan Rickford, are Robert Burns (DTI), Neil Capp (DTI), Sir Bryan Carsberg (former IASB), Bryan Cheffins (University of Cambridge), Deborah Chesworth (FSA), John Coates (Harvard Law School), Tom Crossland (FSA), Paul Davies (LSE), Mike Edbury (DTI), Clive Edrupt (CBI), Julian Franks (London Business School), Brenda Hannigan (University of Southampton), Mary Keegan (ASB), Vanessa Knapp (Freshfields), Sebastian Kuck (BIICL), David Lawton (HM Treasury), Andrew Lennard (ASB), Elena Monaci (University of Siena), Mike Noakes (HM Treasury), Patricia Peter (IOD), Richard Thorpe (FSA), Andrew Watchman (DTI), Malcolm Woodford (former PwC). The group examines different regimes of corporate capital rules. The aim is to propose an efficient and effective model for the UK and the EU that considers the legal, economic and accounting points of view.

## **United Nations Food and Agricultural Organisation Policy on International Trade Rules**

Kevin R Gray wrote a report for the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organisation on the right to food and international trade rules.

## **Armenian Public Sector Reform Programme**

Over the next four years the Institute will be involved in this major project in conjunction with PricewaterhouseCoopers on behalf of the Department for International Development. Its overall aim is to improve the efficiency, effectiveness, accountability, transparency and responsiveness of all levels of public administration within Armenia as part of DFID's ultimate aim of poverty alleviation. The Institute will advise the Government of Armenia on wide-ranging law reforms.

As part of this project a study tour of senior Armenian ministers and public lawyers visited the UK in July; this culminated in a seminar at the British Institute on 29 July where they received a series of presentations from among others Mr Justice Jackson.

## **Competition Law Forum makes policy recommendations to European Competition Network**

Following the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the British Institute's Competition Law Forum, on 19 June, 2003 on 'Modernisation - Ensuring Consistency, Avoiding Conflict', a group of interested CLF members formed a smaller 'Modernisation Expert Group'. The Group met regularly over the summer months to prepare suggestions to help the 26 authorities that make up the European Competition Network (ECN) to implement an efficient, effective and consistent approach in exercising their parallel competences with respect to the enforcement of EC competition rules.

On 19 August, the Modernisation Expert Group's submitted a detailed policy paper - entitled '*Cooperation within the European Competition Network*' - to the ECN authorities, which made recommendations on case allocation within the ECN, and on how leniency applications and confidential information should be treated. ### **Comparative Law**

On 17 June a Competition Law Practitioner Workshop on *Selective Distribution* was held in the Council Chamber, chaired by Ms Suyong Kim, of Denton Wilde Sapte. Speakers were Rona Bar-Isaac of Denton Wilde Sapte, Dr Andrea Coscelli of Lexecon and Ross Denton of Baker & McKenzie.
