



Statistics Consultant for Anti-trafficking Law and Policy Project

Background

1. The British Institute of International and Comparative Law (BIICL) is seeking a Statistics Consultant (SC) to provide expert input into a project focusing on anti-trafficking legislation and policies.
2. The project will assess the links and sequencing of specific factors that have improved political will and capacity in national governments to address trafficking in persons and led to sustained and comprehensive anti-trafficking efforts. The project will conduct a meta-analysis of the current research and contribute a new dataset through expert interviews, a first-of-its-kind global survey and a series of 10 case studies. Requirements

3. The analytical requirements of this role would be suitable for someone with experience in statistics and related techniques. It will require knowledge of appropriate software packages.
4. We expect the consultant will hold a postgraduate qualification (MA/MSC or higher) in statistics or a postgraduate degree in social sciences with strong training in quantitative analysis. S/he will have
 - Familiarity with, and competencies in, analysis of various types of datasets;
 - A demonstrable track record of work of a similar nature, with experience on similar research projects being desirable;
 - A good level of proficiency in English (with additional languages being an advantage).
5. Key takes for the consultancy will include:
 - Conducting analysis of the relationship between a range of relevant indices (dataset to be provided by BIICL);
 - Supporting the design of a survey study (providing input from an analysis/statistical perspective);
 - Conducting and presenting data analysis, including survey data;
 - Developing an appropriate analytical model and conducting other specialized analysis to answer critical research questions of interest to the project; and
 - Responding to questions regarding study design or data analysis from the research team and project funder.
6. We estimate a total of 10 days of consultancy will be required across the duration of the project (2019-2021).
