This event will provide an opportunity to hear leading experts comment on the UK's implementation of judgments of the European Court of Human Rights and to reflect on the wider implementation crisis at Strasbourg.

Following our successful event last year on reform of the European Court of Human Rights and its longer-term future, the Bingham Centre and Leicester Law School are organising another event in London, this time focusing on the implementation of the Court's judgments. In its latest annual report, the Committee of Ministers, which is responsible for supervising the execution of the Court's judgments, reported that while the total number of pending cases had fallen, a number of major challenges remain. Failing to implement the Court's judgments in a timely and effective manner undermines the rule of law, and poses significant challenges for the credibility and legitimacy of the Convention system.
