Gary S. Glazer was elected to the Court of Common Pleas in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in November, 1991. He has served as a trial judge in the Criminal and Civil Divisions hearing a wide variety of matters in both jury and non-jury settings. He has presided over capital and non-capital homicides, serious non-homicide criminal offenses, medical malpractice cases, class actions, administrative appeals, real estate cases, tax cases, toxic tort matters and general civil litigation. Prior to the bench, Judge Glazer served as an Assistant United States Attorney in Philadelphia where he was chief of the Fraud Section and worked in private law firms in Philadelphia and Chicago.

In 2005, Judge Glazer was the recipient of a Fulbright Senior Specialist Grant to lecture (in French) at the Ecole Nationale de la Magistrature in Paris concerning the American judicial process. He has also lectured in Russia and Belarus. He has published articles in France and the United States and is an adjunct instructor in Trial Practice at Villanova University Law School.

Judge Glazer is a graduate of Ohio State University (cum laude and with distinction) and received his law degree from Case Western Reserve University.
